Dear Messrs Lewis and Augustini,

I write to request permission from the Georgetown Community Partnership (GCP) to utilize 1426 36th Street, NW, Washington DC, to house the Beeck Center for Social Impact & Innovation. Per the requirements of our Campus Plan the university cannot use its properties on 36th street between O and P for undergraduate residence without obtaining permission from the GCP to use properties for other than residential purposes.

The Beeck Center for Social Impact & Innovation exists to inspire and prepare students, faculty and global leaders with the necessary skills to generate and innovate solution-based social change both locally and internationally. It promotes collaborative spaces for fostering innovation and providing experiential opportunities to pragmatically impact the social sector.

The Beeck Center currently has large collaborative space in the Intercultural Center. This space is used for large meetings, events, and presentations. This space where work with students is conducted and where visitors are received. The Beeck Center seeks occupy the property located at 1426 36th Street for administrative purposes. Specifically, the property would house administrative support staff and post-doctorate research activities and will consist of five to seven professionals. Specific mission activities will consist of research, writing papers, planning events, and various administrative work.

Consideration of Community Impacts

- *Facility use:* Administrative use only.
- *Hours of operation:* Monday through Friday, 8:30AM until 5:30PM with occasional evening and weekend use.
- *Noise:* No noise producing activities will occur in the facility.
- *Parking:* Staff will be directed that street parking will not be authorized and managed accordingly.

- *Visitors:* The Beeck Center administrative offices will have few visitors. Student and other collaboration activities are conducted at the ICC. Foot traffic to the facility will be minimal and primarily be the staff assigned to the facility.

The ability to accommodate the growth of the Beeck Center's administrative staff is critical to its mission and we believe it will not cause any objectionable conditions to the community. As such I request your approval to occupy 1426 36th Street, NW, Washington DC for the Beeck Center as described above and pursuant to appropriate coordination with the District Office of Zoning.
